International Stop the Pressure Day- 17 November

Thursday 17 November marks this year's International Stop The Pressure Day-Which is a chance to reflect on the major harm and distress that can result from pressure ulcers. These are serious, localised injuries to the skin and/or underlying tissue as a result of pressure, or pressure/shear with friction- which have a huge impact on a patient's quality of life leading to increased pain, risk of infection, depression and even death. Pressure ulcers cost the NHS and care organisations in the UK around £6.5 billion per year, affect around 700,000 people every year and yet many pressure ulcers are avoidable if simple knowledge is provided and preventative best practice is followed.

How are your team planning to fight pressure damage this November? There are many ways you can get involved which can be found below or through this <u>poster</u> which you can display in your service.

- Tell us how your teams are working to "Stop the Pressure" for those in your care— We can share your great work with providers across North Yorkshire and York so we can share best practice and learn from each other.
- Get creative an organise activities with your staff and residents to promote pressure ulcer prevention. This is your chance to pro[1]mote the simple steps we can all take to prevent them and protect those in our care
- Take part in "React to Red" training as a refresher on when to identify someone at risk of pressure damage, and how to prevent it
- Join us at the Partners in Care Virtual Forum on Thursday 17 November
 2.00-2.45 (Vale of York Providers only)- Which will be themed session with the tissue viability service focusing on the importance of preventing

- pressure ulcers. All staff are welcome at this forum— Don't forget to bring along any pressure ulcer champions

Capacity Tracker: DHSC Mandatory Submission Reminder- Deadline Today

A reminder to all CQC registered care homes and providers of domiciliary services, that the window will be opening this window for the mandated Department of Health and Social Care submission through the Capacity Tracker. All providers must complete the tracker at least once between the 8th and midday on the 14th (Today) of the month as condition of registration. There are potential fines as a last resort for providers who do not update- so please be mindful of this. A reminder this doesn't replace the need for more regular (preferably daily) usage to allow local authority and health partners to support providers. Climbing to New Heights

This week we are sharing the story of Agnes Kaye who is a resident of Hambleton Grange Care Home in Thirsk, who at the age of 98 has recently become the oldest person to complete a 50-foot tree top challenge! Agnes grew up on a farm in Kipling in Scotland, and would climb every tree in the area as a child, and spoke to her care team about the joy she felt when she would reach the top of a tall tree- and how much she wished she could climb a tree once again. The care team took up the challenge to make this possible, got in touch with Carlton Lodge Climbing Centre, who invite Agnes to take on their Tree Climbing Challenge. Upon completing the challenge Agnes was named 'most spritely and mature person to climb this tree'.

Courier Fraud Alert for Care Providers

The Economic Crime Unit at North Yorkshire Police have a circulated an <u>alert</u> to providers, following an increase in cases of 'Courier Fraud' specifically targeted at residents of care homes and retirement villages. Courier fraud occurs when a fraudster contacts victims by telephone purporting to be a police officer or bank official. Victims are then asked to co-operate in an investigation by attending their bank and withdrawing. It will typically follow one of the below 4 patterns

- Bank card expiry: Fraudsters claim to be from the victim's bank and say their card is no longer valid. They ask for the pin number and then send a "courier" to collect the card before using it for fraudulent purposes.
- **Purchasing high end items:** The suspects pretend to be police officers and ask the victim to help with an undercover operation by purchasing expensive items like watches, jewellery and gold. One the item is bought, the victim will hand over the item to the criminal.
- **Computer takeover**: The fraudster telephones the victim, purporting to be from their internet service provider, saying that they have had an issue with their internet connectivity and they are due compensation.
- Counterfeit cash/bank investigation: A person claiming to be a police or banking official informs the victim that they need to help with a banking corruption investigation. The victim is told to withdraw a large amount of money and the cash is picked up later by a courier to "check for fingerprints or to identify counterfeit bank notes"

Providers are asked to be vigilant, and that anyone who receives an unexpected call from someone claiming to be one of these officials should verify they are speaking to someone genuine: hang up, wait five minutes and call back on a number they know is genuine.

Energy Priority Service for Care Provider and Vulnerable Individuals (Updated with additional information)

Ahead of winter and following recent incidents resulting from storms and burst water mains, we are re-sharing the below links it has to support any care settings are not registered with their utility companies as a priority service/customer. If not registered, when an incident occurs which does not trigger a multi-agency major incident response utility companies use their priority customers information to prioritise a response and not information from other agencies. Therefore, support offered to care settings may be delayed and they would be included in the response to the wider public, which could lead to a lengthy wait before any action is taken. Please ensure you have registered your service as a priority

service/customer and make reference to this in your Business Continuity Plans. Links to the main utility providers are:
