Access to Winter Vaccination for Social Care Staff

A reminder that all frontline social care staff are eligible for both the COVID-19 booster and flu vaccination this winter, and staff are strongly encouraged to take up this offer. Vaccination remains the best way to protect yourself and those in

your care from serious illness this winter, and strengthen our health and care system against infection. Through this <u>link</u> you can access a set of slides shared at last weeks Partners in Care Virtual Forum, which detail how staff across the area can access this winter.

- The Askham Bar site in York is now available for walk in appointments, and are able to co-vaccinate those registered with a York GP practice simultaneously with both flu and COVID.19 booster.
- CityWide pharmacies across York have opened a number of new vaccination sites including in Clifton, Poppleton, Acomb and Bishopthorpe Road. These sites are open for <u>booked appointments</u> and can also simultaneously vaccinate.
- Pharmacies across the area continue to offer the flu vaccination, which can be booked through individual websites.
- Information around access in the wider North Yorkshire area including Pickering, Malton, Harrogate, Knaresborough, Northallerton and Scarborough can be found through this <u>link</u>.

Remember to please bring work ID to guarantee you will be accepted for vaccination. There are a series of <u>resources</u> available which can be shared with staff or displayed to support vaccination uptake. Perfect Discharge Week (For York Area Providers)

Colleagues from York Hospital, NHS York Health and Care Partnership and City of York Council Social Services, will be working differently during the week of 21 November to 25 November 2022, to facilitate as many discharges from the York Acute, Community sites and York Care Unit

Recently City of York Council have between 30 and 50 clients who are medically fit for discharge but for a variety of reasons they cannot be transferred into the community as local services cannot be found for them. From Monday 21, we are sharing our resources and thinking differently- but we need your assistance to make this happen. Please can we ask you to ensure your information on the capacity tracker is up to date, and therefore we can concentrate our efforts with those of you who do have vacancies. A reminder that beds entered into the "vacant accepting admissions" section should be only those beds which you have the staffing and capacity to admit to at present, and any other vacancies should be added to the "vacant not accepting admissions" section. We will also need updated information from domiciliary providers, as most people want to return home with appropriate support.

International Stop the Pressure Day 2022- What is a Pressure Ulcer and Moisture Associated Skin Damage?

Thank you to all those who took part in this years International Stop the Pressure Day, to raise awareness of the impact pressure damage can cause and how we can work together to prevent it in our services. Sarah Coggon (Tissue Viability Nurse, York Hospital) provided a really comprehensive refresher session at last weeks Partners in Care which covered the causes of pressure damage, signs to look out for, categorisations, difference between pressure damage and moisture and how we can prevent and respond to them for those in our care. Awareness of Swallowing Difficulties- Training Video for Care Homes

Humber Teaching NHS Foundation Trust's SALT team have produced a <u>video</u> <u>training session</u> on awareness of swallowing difficulties. The team provide the community nursing service across the Scarborough, Ryedale, Filey, Whitby and Pocklington patcj. This 30 minute video is appropriate for carers and registered nurses, and would also be beneficial to kitchen staff and people who are new to care work. The focus is on awareness of swallowing difficulties and the steps prior to diet and fluid modification, and references the a care home swallowing pack. There are plans to make a further video covering diet/fluid modification which will be shared once ready.
