Helping to Improve Access to Cancer Screening for People with a Learning Disability

Marie Kotzur from the University of Glasgow is looking for paid and family carers in England to take part in an interview. The researchers are offering participants a gift card of £30 as a thank you for giving their time.

The study aims to understand the experience of screening for breast, bowel, and cervical cancers among people with learning disabilities, how their access to screening can be improved, and what could make cancer screening easier for

people with learning disabilities. The researchers are keen to speak with carers who support women with learning disabilities aged 25 to 75 years and/or men with learning disabilities aged 60-75 years. The interview can be by telephone or video call and the interviews will last between 30 and 60 minutes.

Developing a Minimum Dataset for Homecare (DACHA-DOM)

Population Health Sciences Institute at Newcastle University and the Social Policy Research Unit at the University of York are conducting a survey of homecare providers. They're asking how homecare data is collected, recorded and stored, together with the barriers faced. The project is focused on understanding the feasibility of implementing a 'minimum data set in homecare', meaning a system of standardized data collection that could be used to evaluate the support needs of local populations over time, inform resource allocation and monitor quality. New NICE Advocacy Guidance

This new guidance covers advocacy for people using health and social care services in all adult settings (including young people under 18 using adult services). It describes how to commission and deliver effective advocacy, as well as identifying who should be offered advocacy (including who is legally entitled to it). Trusted Assessment Forms (TAFs)- Quality Improvement and Survey

North Yorkshire and City of York Council are working in partnership with York and Scarborough Hospital Foundation Trust to improve the quality and contained information of the Trusted Assessment Forms (TAFs). The TAFs are the supporting documents, sent to providers, when a patient is deemed as medically optimised and fit for discharge. The aim of the improvement work, is to support providers to speed up their decision making around accepting a person into a Residential / Nursing establishment or for a package of care in the person's own home.

The aim of this improvement work is to reduce the number of delays at the acute hospital sites, who are under the extreme pressures due to delays in discharging people at the right time. As part of this work, we would like to offer our providers a voice in this work and the chance to engage in the development of a 'gold standard TAF'. Helping You Stay Well This Winter

If you're worried about your health, don't delay, your NHS wants to see you — help us help you get the care you need this winter. Winter conditions can be bad for our health, especially for people aged 65 or older, and people with long-term conditions such as heart or kidney disease, COPD (including emphysema and chronic bronchitis), asthma or diabetes. A leaflet produced by the NHS with important information that can help you stay well this winter can be found through this link, which may be particularly useful to those colleagues visiting who visit residents in their own homes.
