You are invited to take part in a research study we are working on, which is entitled: *Development of core outcome sets for effectiveness trials of interventions to prevent and/or treat delirium in long term care.*

Our aim is to develop international consensus on a core outcome set for research studies which assess interventions to prevent or treat delirium. A core outcome set (COS) is an agreed set of outcomes that all such studies should seek to measure. If all future interventions for delirium report these outcomes, it makes it easier to compare their effectiveness, and combine data for similar interventions to identify benefits and harms that are otherwise too small to be detected. This supports clinical staff to more rapidly identify the best interventions for the condition.

This involves asking participants to rate a range of outcomes which have been identified at an earlier stage of the project based on how important you think they are. We are recruiting survivors of delirium, their family members, expert clinicians, and researchers in delirium care. We would be very grateful if you would be willing to complete two on-line surveys as part of this Delphi process. Each should take no more than 30 minutes to complete.
