Capacity Tracker- DHSC Mandatory Submission Reminder

A reminder to all CQC registered care homes and providers of domiciliary services, that the window will be opening this week for the mandated Department of Health and Social Care submission through the Capacity Tracker. All providers must complete the tracker at least once during this period at a condition of registration. The window falls between the **8 April** and **14 April**, and there are potential fines as a last resort for providers who do not update- so please be mindful of this. Further information on how the regulations will be enforced can be found through this link. A reminder this doesn't replace the need for more regular (preferably daily) usage to allow local authority and health partners to support providers. NB: North Yorkshire providers will see an additional survey on the Capacity Tracker this month. Unless you are a home taking part in a pilot being conducted by North Yorkshire Council there is no requirement to complete these.

Trusted Assessor Form Care Provider Engagement Event

When: Thursday 13 April 2.00-4.00 at LNER Community Stadium, York

York and Scarborough Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust are leading work to improve the quality of information contained within Trusted Assessment Forms (TAFs), which are the supporting documents sent to providers when a patient is deemed as medically optimised and fit for discharge. The aim of the improvement work is to support providers to speed up their decision making around accepting a person into a residential / nursing establishment or for a package of care in the person's own home. The aim of this improvement work is to reduce the number of delays at the acute hospital sites, who are under the extreme pressures due to delays in discharging people at the right time. As part of this work, we would like to offer our providers a voice in this work and the chance to engage in the development of a 'gold standard TAF'. Therefore we are hosting engagements on the open to all providers from across our area, as a chance to discuss openly your experiences of receiving these forms, and the content you would like to see to support your service in accepting discharges.
