Awareness of Swallowing Difficulties- Training Video for Care Homes

Humber Teaching NHS Foundation Trust's SALT team have produced a <u>video</u> <u>training session</u> on awareness of swallowing difficulties. The team provide the community nursing service across the Scarborough, Ryedale, Filey, Whitby and Pocklington patch. This 30 minute video is appropriate for carers and registered nurses, and would also be beneficial to kitchen staff and people who are new to care work. The focus is on awareness of swallowing difficulties and the steps prior to diet and fluid modification, and references the a care home swallowing pack. There are plans to make a further video covering diet/fluid modification which will be shared once ready.

Need to know



Local Elections 2023

Ahead of the local elections taking place in City of York and East Riding of Yorkshire on **04 May**, a reminder that there government have brought in the requirement to show photo ID before voting this year. Accepted ID includes a passport, a driver's licence and some travel passes, such as an older person's buss pass, but student cards are not included. The requirement to show photo ID at the polling station is a new requirement, introduced by the UK Government's Elections Act which was passed last year and comes into effect for the first time this May. Please let staff, residents and visitors know that the photo ID requirement comes into force at the local council elections in May 2023. If you do not have an accepted form of photo ID, you no longer look like the photo on your ID, or the name on your photo ID is different to your name on the electoral register, you can apply for a free voter authority certificate through this <u>link</u> online, or this <u>link</u> to request a paper form. The deadline to apply is **Tuesday 25 April at 17.00**

As an alternative, anyone who does not already have one can apply for a the postal vote. When applying for a postal vote, identity checks take place at the time of registering and again when postal votes are verified, so voter ID or a voter authority certificate are not required. The deadline to apply is **Tuesday 18 April at 17.00**

National Emergency Alert Test- Sunday 23 April

A <u>new emergency alert system</u> has launched, allowing the Government and emergency services to send alerts directly to mobile phones when there is risk to life.Alerts include details of areas impacted and instructions on how to respond. A UK-wide test takes place on **Sunday 23 April 3pm** Some groups, including care providers, care home residents and others living or working in specialised settings, may choose to opt out to protect those who are easily distressed or confused. However, the Government recommends everyone participates to help keep individuals and communities safe.

Care providers can use this <u>toolkit</u> to share further details of the Emergency Alerts campaign. It will be used to warn you in the event of emergencies, such as severe flooding. Emergency Alerts are sent to all compatible mobile phones within an area of risk. They don't track your location, need your phone number, or collect personal data. Only the government and the emergency services will be able to send them. If you don't have a mobile phone, you'll still be kept informed through other channels. If you get an Emergency Alert on your phone, you'll hear a loud, siren-like sound. A message on your screen will tell you about the emergency and how best to respond. Care Workforce Pathway for Adult Social Care: Call for Evidence

The Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) has launched <u>a call for</u> <u>evidence</u> to guide the development of a new care workforce pathway for adult social care. Over the coming months, DHSC will communicate with people who work in and draw on adult social care to co-develop a pathway setting out the skills, knowledge and behaviours care colleagues need to deliver high-quality, personalised, compassionate care and support. The call for evidence runs for eight weeks and closes 11.45pm on **31 May 2023**.

Coronation Toolkit- Plan Your Event
