Emerade Prefilled Injection Pens – Product Recall

You should already be aware of this product recall through your services arrangements to receive drug alerts and patient safety warnings in line with CQC guidance and may already have contacted by the GP surgery regarding this. It is included here simply as a reminder.

If you/your service were not aware of the product recall please ensure that you are signed up to receive such alerts. You can do this via the Central Alerting System (CAS). 

Curious About Care- Values Based Recruitment Tool

Values-based recruitment is essential to ensuring you employ a compassionate, person-centred workforce that is committed to providing quality care. It can be tricky to know how to assess a candidate's values and whether they align with those of your organisation. Skills for Care has worked with social care experts at University of York to create 'Curious about Care', a free evidence-based tool that can be used as part of your recruitment process. It allows you to explore different scenarios with a candidate to better understand their values, helping you assess if they are a good fit for your organisation. Capacity Tracker- DHSC Mandatory Submission Reminder

A reminder to all CQC registered care homes and providers of domiciliary services, that the window will be opening this week for the mandated Department of Health and Social Care submission through the Capacity Tracker. All providers must complete the tracker at least once during this period at a condition of registration. The window this month falls between the **8 May** and **15 May**, and there are potential fines as a last resort for providers who do not update- so please be mindful of this. Further information on how the regulations will be enforced can be

found through this [link](#). A reminder this doesn't replace the need for more regular (preferably daily) usage to allow local authority and health partners to support providers. For any support regarding the Capacity Tracker- Please contact the national helpdesk on: 0191 691 3729


Digital Skills Framework for the Adult Social Care Sector Launch

Skills for Care and The Digitising Social Care Programme (a joint NHS/DHSC unit) invite you to the launch of the updated Digital Skills Framework.

The Digital Skills Framework is a free resource to support the development of digital skills across the adult social care workforce. It's structured around seven themes and aims to help employers and individuals working in adult social care to plan their learning and choose the right digital skills training for their needs. Adult Social Care Nurse Leadership Programme

This programme is aimed at Registered Nurses working in a Social Care service. You will be in a leadership role such as head of care, team leader, care co-ordinator, registered manager or deputy manager with a clinical lead. It is designed to support delegates to understand their leadership style and the impact this has through undertaking a 360 appraisal, delegates will be allocated an independent mentor to further develop their leadership and management skills. The workshop sessions will be interactive with presentations, discussions and exercises that will support the development of knowledge. Each session will include an Action Learning Set which will

enable real time discussion and generate ideas and potential resolutions to issues. Delegates will undertake a work based project to embed their learning.
