National Volunteer Programme Extending Into Adult Social Care

NHS and Care Volunteer Responders, a national volunteering programme, is now available to support adult social care providers in England. Volunteers can help improve people's experience of care and free up time for frontline staff to prioritise support for those who need it most. Initially, care providers will be able to make referrals for 'Check In and Chat' telephone calls. More services will be available soon, with volunteers able to support with shopping and prescription delivery. Volunteers will never be asked to provide personal care or undertake roles that paid staff would do. Making a referral is quick and easy. To find out more please follow this link.



Safeguarding Programme of Free On-Line Sessions Announced for Safeguarding Week- 19-23 June 2023

Partners from Safeguarding Adults Boards, Children's Safeguarding Partnerships, Community Safety Partnerships across North Yorkshire, the City of York and East Riding have come together and developed an extensive programme of learning events, seminars and interactive sessions. Spurred on by the success of Safeguarding Week 2022, the safeguarding partners have worked to extend the range of topics being covered this year. Whilst a number of the sessions are open only to professionals working in the safeguarding sector, the majority of the sessions are also open to the public. Delay to Liberty Protection Safeguards

The Government announced it will delay the implementation of Liberty Protection Safeguards (LPS). In an <u>evidence session</u> with the Health and Social Care Select Committee (HSCSC), Minister for Care Helen Whately said it was 'one of the difficult decisions in looking at priorities in the light of inflation and pressures on resources' and that 'the decision was not taken lightly at all'. They have said they intend to publish a summary of the consultation responses they received and do accept the need to move away from the current process and towards LPS



Capacity Tracker- DHSC Mandatory Submission Reminder

A reminder to all CQC registered care homes and providers of domiciliary services, that the window will be opening this week for the mandated Department of Health and Social Care submission through the Capacity Tracker. All providers must complete the tracker at least once during this period at a condition of registration. The window this month falls between the **8 June** and **14 June**, and there are potential fines as a last resort for providers who do not update- so please be mindful of this. A reminder this doesn't replace the need for more regular (preferably daily) usage to allow local authority and health partners to support providers. NB: North Yorkshire providers will see an additional survey on the Capacity Tracker this month. Unless you are a home taking part in a pilot being conducted by North Yorkshire Council there is no requirement to complete this.

Guiding Principles for Delegated Healthcare Activity

Together with the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) and partners, Skills for Care has co-developed voluntary guiding principles to support personcentred, safe and effective delegation of healthcare activities to paid care workers, including personal assistants. Delegation has been happening for several years to enable people to have more choice and control, with an

Using The Ambulance Service- Resources for Individuals with Learning Disability or Autism

The London Ambulance Service have coproduced new resources to support people with a learning disability or autistic people when using the ambulance service. Although designed by the London Ambulance Service, they are not London-specific.

The resources are designed to help people know what to expect when an ambulance arrives, including assessments by the paramedics, the inside of an ambulance and demystifying common concerns. They aim to reduce barriers to accessing the service so that people get the help they need.

You can use these proactively or in the event of someone needing an ambulance. They include an <u>easy read</u> document about what to do when an ambulance comes to help you and a social story about someone going to hospital by ambulance. There is also a video about travelling to hospital by ambulance which is available <u>without subtitles</u> and <u>with subtitles</u>. <u>Find more resources on the London Ambulance Service</u>



Data Security and Protection Toolkit (DSPT)- Don't Forget to Resubmit

For those care providers yet to complete the DSPT for 2022/23- the deadline to do so is **30 June 2023**. The DSPT is a self-completion assessment for providers showing what the requirements to demonstrate you are keeping people's information safe, and to protect your business from the risk of a data breach or a cyber-attack. It demonstrates compliance with GDPR/Data Protection Act/CQC KLOE's and is a requirement for all providers holding an NHS Standard contract, as well certain local authority contracts.

If you have previously completed you will need to review and resubmit.

There is local support available including training workshops guiding you through completing, and 1:1 support to providers in the North East and Yorkshire through an NHS England Team who can be contacted by emailing:
