GOVERNING BODY MEETING: 3 DECEMBER 2015

Chief Clinical Officer's Report

1. Purpose of the Report

To provide an update on a number of projects, initiatives and meetings which have taken place since the last Governing Body meeting and any associated issues.

2. System Resilience

- 2.1 Through the work of the System Resilience Group, the National Emergency Care Improvement Programme (ECIP) is supporting the Vale of York urgent and emergency care system to improve performance, particularly this winter.
- 2.1.1 ECIP is sponsored by NHS England, Monitor, the NHS Trust Development Agency and the Department of Health. An enhanced offer from the Emergency Care Intensive Support Team (ECIST), with experts from health and social care, is providing support that includes an innovative collaboration network which provides links to strong performers and additional programme management support to help local systems aid resilience planning.
- 2.1.2 This work, being delivered through the System Resilience Group, includes the following five programmes:
 - Assess to admit
 - Intermediate care model
 - Delayed transfer of care
 - Early supported discharge
 - Discharge to assess
- 2.2 To ensure that local systems are resilient during the winter period we have a number of schemes in place. These include Urgent Care Practitioners, the ArcLight project, the Yorkshire Housing Handyman Service and the Rapid Assessment Team. The step up and step down beds scheme in Fulford Nursing Home has also been extended for the winter period. The impact of these schemes has been evaluated over the last six months and monthly monitoring against key indicators is in place for the winter.
- 2.3 The CCG and York Teaching Hospital NHS Foundation Trust are working together to review flow at York Hospital Emergency Department (ED). This includes putting in place processes that will ensure the rapid triage of patients so they move efficiently through the system, where this is clinically appropriate. Whilst this work takes place, we continue to fund the GP in the ED.

2.4 To ensure further resilience, additional sessions throughout the Christmas and New Year period have also been offered to Primary Care.

3. Primary Care Co-commissioning

- 3.1 Previously created as an affiliate to the Quality and Finance Committee, the Primary Care Co-commissioning Committee has been reviewed and established as a separate committee chaired by Keith Ramsay. The membership has also been reviewed and now includes two members from the CCG's Council of Representatives.
- 3.2 The CCG has also established a Primary Care Delivery Group that is chaired by Dr Tim Maycock. The group reports to the Primary Care Cocommissioning Committee and drives the delivery of pathways, schemes and funding bids for Primary Care.
- 3.3 The next meeting of the Primary Care Co-commissioning Committee takes place at 10am on Tuesday 22 December 2015 at West Offices, York.

4. Integrating Health and Social Care in the Vale of York

Integrated Care Pilots in the Vale of York are the focus of NHS England's annual report – Pioneers, New Models of Care. The report, a short film, features the work of the CCG and its partners in Selby, Pocklington and York.

5. Musculoskeletal services

- 5.1 Through the mobilisation phase of the MSK procurement, for a number of reasons that would have materially affected the outcome of the process, the CCG made a decision not to proceed to contract signature. This has been discussed fully with Governing Body members and the Governing Body is asked to formally ratify the decision made.
- 5.2 The CCG has had very positive discussions with York Teaching Hospital NHS Foundation Trust regarding the local Musculoskeletal (MSK) service.
- 5.3 It is confirmed that GP referrals to York Teaching Hospital NHS Foundation Trust's MSK service will re-start on 1 December 2015. We continue to work with colleagues at the Trust regarding access to self-referrals to MSK services.

6. CCG Forecast Financial Position 2015/16

Following discussion with NHS England formal notification was received that, as part of NHS England's categorisation of CCGs who deviate from financial plans, NHS Vale of York CCG is now classed as an organisation in turnaround due to the ongoing deterioration of the financial position.

7. Council of Representatives

Members of the Governing Body met with the Council of Representatives on Thursday 19 November 2015. This was a very productive meeting. Pat Crowley, Chief Executive of York Teaching Hospital NHS Foundation Trust, attended part of the meeting to discuss collaborative working and future models of care.

8. System Leaders Work

The System Leaders Board met on 19 November 2015. This was a very positive meeting with agreement to working collaboratively together across the health and social care system to improve care for the people of the Vale of York and also Scarborough, Whitby and Ryedale.

9. Emergency Preparedness, Response and Resilience

Rachel Potts, Chief Accountable Officer for Emergency Preparedness, Response and Resilience (EPRR), presented the EPRR Self-Assessment Framework and updated policies for EPRR and Pandemic Flu to the Governing Body for approval at its Part II meeting on 5 November 2015. NHS Vale of York Clinical Commissioning Group has undertaken a self-assessment against required areas of the NHS England Core Standards for EPRR and the Governing Body agreed the CCG was fully compliant against the core standards.
