Annual Health Checks



People with a learning disability often have poorer physical and mental health than other people. This does not need to be the case.

It is important that everyone **over the age of 14** who is on their doctor's learning disability register has an annual health check.

Individuals can ask to go on this register if they think they have a learning disability. Please support individuals and families/carers to contact their GP Surgery if they are not already registered to ensure they are invited to have an annual health check.

Vaccinations



People with a learning disability are at higher risk of developing serious complications due to viruses such as flu and Covid19.

Individuals can get the flu and COVID19 vaccines for free if they are on the learning disability register.

Please encourage, support and inform people you support to get their flu and Covid19 vaccinations.

Breast Cancer Awareness Month



Breast cancer is one of the most common types of cancer in the UK. Around one in 8 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer during their lifetime.

Evidence from England suggests that death rates from breast cancer in women with learning disabilities do not differ from those in the general population and is therefore as much a health issue as for other women.

For women with learning disabilities, knowledge of breast cancer including associated risks, preventative factors and signs and symptoms may be extremely limited. Women with learning disabilities may not easily communicate their symptoms and may be at risk of delayed diagnosis. (Public Health England).

Anyone registered with a GP as female will be invited for NHS breast screening every 3 years between the ages of 50 and 71.

Introducing ... Francesca Marshall - Learning Disabilities Care Coordinator



My name is Francesca Marshall, and I am based at Derwent Practice in Norton, Malton.

I work for the North Riding Community Health PCN and my job role is the Learning Disabilities Care Coordinator. I work across 4 GP practices within our PCN.

My job role includes dealing with phone calls and appointments for learning disabilities patients, annual reviews, administering flu vaccines, housebound visits, and all other holistic checks- bloods, BP, BMI etc.

I also liaise with support staff, district nurses, Community Learning Disabilities Team at Eastfield clinic and care agencies and complete relevant health referrals.

Attending your annual reviews is very important, it enables us to see where we can offer more support, but equally it enables us to keep medical information up to date, and ensuring you stay well.
