## Modern day slavery is often hidden in plain sight

#### **Exploitation**

Some workers may be being exploited in legitimate industries. They may have been brought into the UK at a huge financial cost, then expected to work for little or no pay, and without appropriate contracts or training.

#### Often there are signs to spot:

- Tired physical appearance
- Working excessively long hours
- Frightened/distressed
- Unwashed/dirty clothing
- Lack of personal hygiene
- Lack of ID documents
- Little or no spoken/written English
- Appear not to have the required skills/knowledge for the role
- Lack appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE)
- Unaware of their employment rights
- Tied into accommodation by employer.
