# **Urgent Suspected Cancer**

## USC Brain - pre-shortlisted for Hull

There is no USC Brain Cancer Service at York & Scarborough Teaching Hospitals. The nearest service providers are Leeds Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust (0113 2432 799) or Hull and East Yorkshire Hospitals NHS Trusts (01482 875 875). Please ensure a USC Brain referral proforma is completed (Hull only) and attached to allow onward referral to secondary care

## <u>USC Cancer of Unknown Primary</u> – pre-shortlisted for York Hospital

- Complete pathway questionnaire
  - o Service available at York Hospital only
  - \*USC\* Malignancy of Unknown Origin (MUO) (York) York & Scarborough Hospitals has dates and time available

#### USC Lower GI

- Complete USC pathway questionnaire
- FIT result is **required** to process the referral, unless selecting one of the following where a FIT is requested. A referral can be made without the result attached
  - o Palpable Anorectal Mass or ulceration
  - o Abdominal Mass (request FIT but do not delay referral)
  - o NEW IDA and >60 (request FIT but do not delay referral)
- Please see Gateway or RSS website for criteria information
- York Hospital, Harrogate Hospital, Leeds LGI, Scarborough Hospital, Bridlington Hospital All RAS clinics

## USC Lung - pre-shortlisted for York or Scarborough Hospital

- Complete pathway questionnaire

There are no requirements for the following clinic types. All can be booked to General Cardiology services: York Hospital, Malton community Hospital, Scarborough general Hospital, Bridlington hospital- all RAS clinics

Heart Failure – pre-shortlisted for York Hospital NHS Vale of York Clinical Commissioning Group - Heart Failure

## York Hospital only

- Complete Integrated Pathway Questionnaire on Gateway
  - o Requires ECG and BNP result attached
  - If BNP over 2000 urgent referral required (can still send as urgent if BNP below if GP concerned)
- No proforma needed for Scarborough registered patients unless patient wishes to be seen in York then attach York proforma as an attachment (If no proforma they can still be sent to general cardiology – Scarborough, Bridlington and Malton)
- Can be booked direct to RAS clinic without contacting patient

#### Rapid Access Chest Pain - pre-shortlisted

- Urgent pathway only
- Complete Integrated questionnaire on Gateway
  - o Requires ECG to be less than 4 weeks old
  - o Patient's aged 30+
  - o If <30, please submit an A&G via e-RS for further consideration. If agreement to see patient is obtained, please refer via Gateway as normal and de-select age restrictions on Gateway booking screen
- York Hospital, Scarborough Hospital, Bridlington Hospital All RAS clinics
- · For Leeds border patients, a Leeds Teaching Hospital proforma is required





# Congenital Heart Disease

- No York & Scarborough Trust service (System will bring up general local clinics which do not deal with this issue)
  - Available services include Castle Hill Hospital (Hull) or Leeds General Infirmary (Both RAS clinics)

## Cardiology Genetics

- No York & Scarborough Trust service (System will bring up general local clinics)
  - o Available services include LGI (Inherited Cardiac Conditions service) (RAS Clinic)

#### Lipid

• There is no service, see Endocrinology for this pathway

## **Dietetics Weight Management**

## Tier 2 - pre-shortlisted

- Requires attached Tier 2 proforma
- Criteria:
  - As per the information on the proforma to be eligible for the service, the individual must satisfy ALL the following criteria:
  - Age ≥ 18 years
  - Diagnosed with Diabetes (any type) AND / OR Hypertension
  - Latest BMI ≥ 30 (or ≥ 27.5 if from Black, Asian and ethnic minority backgrounds) BMI must be within last 24 months.

#### and MUST NOT have any of the following characteristics:

- Moderate or severe frailty
- Currently pregnant
- o Have an active eating disorder
- o Bariatric surgery in the last two years
- A weight management programme is considered to pose greater risk of harm than benefit for this individual
- Can be booked direct to clinic without contacting patient.





#### Tier 3 – pre-shortlisted

- VOY service only (only available to VOY GP practices)
- The service is available to patients aged 18 years of age and over, who are registered with a Vale of York CCG GP practice, have a BMI of 35 or over, AND who have maximised primary care and community conservative management
- Requires 3 BMI results
- Patients with a BMI ≥50 will be automatically eligible to access the service.

  <u>Obesity Management Service</u>
- SR patients being referred for Tier 3 is done via the Humber direct not through e-RS.
- Can be booked direct to clinic without contacting patient

#### Diagnostic Endoscopy

## Gastroscopy - pre-shortlisted

- Complete Integrated questionnaire on Gateway
- Routine pathway only or consider a 2WW Upper GI referral if criteria is met
  - o Service available at York or Scarborough Hospital only
- Can be booked direct to clinic without contacting patient

# Diagnostic Physiological Measurement

## Audiology

- Hearing assessment prior to referral to ENT
  - Exclusions to general audiology clinic: Unilateral Tinnitus, asymmetric hearing loss, sudden onset of hearing loss (for less than 3 months), obvious infection - refer directly to the ENT Service
- York Hospital, Malton Hospital, Selby war Memorial, Whitby Hospital, Scarborough Hospital, Thirsk Health Centre All RAS clinics
  - There is a specialised York clinic on e-RS for patients with Dementia (autoroute override if standard audiology clinics shortlisted)
  - There is a specialised York tinnitus clinic under this pathway which deals with Long standing bilateral tinnitus only
  - o For Scarborough registered patients there is a specialised clinic for Tinnitus at Spring Hill House which deals with *Long Standing Bilateral Tinnitus* only
- Patient requesting batteries for their hearing aids do not require a referral to the hospital:
  - Please contact Audiology directly on 01904 726741 and select option 1 for the postal service. Alternatively, you can email them at <a href="mailto:yhs-tr.hearingaid.repairs@nhs.net">yhs-tr.hearingaid.repairs@nhs.net</a> and they will be able to post them out to the patient.





## Endocrinology and Metabolic medicine

There are no requirements for the following clinic types.

  - Adrenal Disorders
  - Gynaecological Endocrinology
  - o Not Otherwise Specified
  - Pituitary & Hypothalamic
  - o Thyroid/Parathyroid
- Metabolic Disorder Clinic: Service available at York or Scarborough Hospital only
  - Lipid Disorders Familial Hypercholesterolaemia
  - Metabolic Bone Disorders

## <u>Immunology</u>

- There are no local services for the following speciality's available services include Castle Hill hospital / St James in Leeds (Treats all Clinical Immunological and Allergic disorder conditions) - All RAS clinics
  - o Autoimmune Disease
  - o Immunodeficiency
  - o Not Otherwise Specified

## Nephrology - pre-shortlisted

Nephrology - York Hospital, Malton Hospital, Selby War Memorial, Scarborough Hospital – Direct Booking available

#### **Renal Diabetes**

- There are no local services for this Clinic type (change clinic type to Nephrology to book to general clinic)
- There is a joint Diabetes / Renal clinic at York (Change to Diabetic Medicine / Clinic Renal Diabetes RAS clinic)





#### Pain Management

- Integrated Chronic Pain questionnaire to completed for York Hospital (Spinal and non-spinal clinics All RAS) pre-shortlisted
- If referring for non-chronic pain, York registered patients can be referred to York Hospital,
   Pinderfields Hospital and Seacroft Leeds (Seacroft do not accept referrals from York and
   Harrogate registered patients without an approved IFR for treatment against Leeds Criteria)
- Acute Motor Loss pathway
  - o Urgent pathway only,
  - o York Hospital only (valeofyorkccg.nhs.uk/seecmsfile/?id=5953&inline=1&inl
- T & T (Treat and Triage) York Hospital only.
- Therapeutic and diagnostic injections for the treatment of spinal pain
  - o Requires a PAT/IFR approval as NOT routinely commission therapeutic spinal injections for cervical, thoracic or Lumbar spine pain.
  - This includes: Spinal Epidural Injections (transforaminal/interlaminar) and nerve root blocks Spinal Facet Joint Injections (FJI)/Medial branch blocks Spinal Radiofrequency Nerve Denervation (rhizolysis/medial branch block/nerve root pulsed denervation) Therapeutic trigger point injections for the management of spinal pain
- For Scarborough registered patients; if referring for non-chronic pain if they meet criteria for CHCP if not only York Hospital

#### Respiratory Medicine

There are no requirements for the following clinic types. All can be booked to General Respiratory services: (York Hospital, Malton Community Hospital, Scarborough General Hospital, Bridlington Hospital - all RAS clinics)

- Not Otherwise Specified For Long Covid clinic requires GP Proforma & Patient Questionnaire as hardcopy attachments (York Hospital only RAS clinic) pre-shortlisted
- Pulmonary Rehabilitation referrals are sent via the AHP pathway to respiratory physiotherapy along with the Pulmonary Rehabilitation proforma which can be found on the website: <u>NHS</u> <u>Vale of York Clinical Commissioning Group - Respiratory</u>
- Home oxygen is not referred through gateway please see link on how to refer <u>NHS Vale of York Clinical Commissioning Group Home Oxygen</u>





#### Surgery Not Otherwise Specified

Hernia (York Hospital, Malton Community Hospital, Scarborough General Hospital, Bridlington Hospital, Selby War Memorial- all RAS clinics – no Direct Booking available)

- Hernia repair for cosmetic reasons or for asymptomatic or minimally symptomatic hernias in adults is NOT routinely commissioned
  - o VBC Check required
- Repair of suspected femoral hernias, inguinal hernias in women, or any irreducible hernias is commissioned and should be referred urgently due to the increased risk of incarceration/strangulation
  - o These hernia referrals DO NOT require a PAT code
  - o Required to be processed as urgent

Lumps and bumps: (York Hospital, Malton community Hospital, Scarborough general Hospital, Bridlington hospital- All RAS clinics)

- Large Lipomas requires PAT code / IFR if does not meet criteria for PAT
- Sebaceous Cysts requires PAT code/ IFR if does not meet criteria for PAT
- Consultation any hospital, surgery would be at York Scarborough or Bridlington Hospital

## **Endocrine Surgery**

There is no local service – please see Endocrinology section of this guide

#### **Urology**

Malton is the one stop clinic for the York/Scarborough area. Initial appointment will be here. Patient will be there for a couple of hours, have any tests done at the time and get results. Follow up appointments may be done at York or Scarborough Hospital. (All RAS clinics)

#### Circumcision

- Requires a PAT otherwise, funding will ONLY be considered where criteria are met.
- Humber and North Yorkshire ICB does NOT routinely commission male circumcision for cultural or religious reasons; the procedure will only be considered where medically necessary.
- Humber and North Yorkshire ICB routinely commission circumcision IF there is evidence of one of the following clinical indications:
  - Lichen sclerosus (chronic inflammation leading to a rigid fibrous foreskin) in males aged 9 years and over
  - Potentially malignant lesions of the prepuce or those causing diagnostic uncertainty
  - Congenital abnormalities with functional impairment
  - Distal scarring of the preputial orifice (a short course of topical corticosteroids might help with mild scarring





- o Painful erections secondary to a tight foreskin
- o Recurrent bouts of infection (balanitis/balanoposthitis
- Redundant prepuce, phimosis (inability to retract the foreskin due to a narrow prepucial ring) sufficient to cause ballooning of the foreskin on micturition; and paraphimosis (inability to pull forward a retracted foreskin)
- o Traumatic injury eg zipper damage
- Congenital urological abnormalities when skin is required for grafting

## (In) Continence

- Female Urinary Problems (Malton) Triage Service
  - o All females with continence issues and associated lower urinary symptoms
- Male Lower Urinary Symptoms (Malton) Triage Service
  - Men > 40 years with lower urinary tract symptoms
  - o If <40 years book to general urology clinic
- Can offer The James cook hospital as a choice:
  - Functional urology is female clinic
    - Canada unala muia mala alimia
    - o General urology is male clinic

## Erectile Dysfunction/Andrology

 One stop ED service; Erectile dysfunction all causes: primary ED, diabetic, pelvic surgery Peyronies disease Premature Ejaculation Low testosterone/ primary hypogonadism (if low FSH and LH and secondary hypogonadism then refer to endocrinology)

## Haematuria (not 2WW)

- VISIBLE HAEMATURIA Referral Criteria: Painless; after one-episode WHATEVER age Painful; Over 40 years old male and female
- NON-VISIBLE HAEMATURIA NB risk of cancer <3% Referral Criteria: Refer all Remember non-visible haematuria is normal with a UTI, therefore only refer if it fulfils the criteria for UTI
- If clinic doesn't appear due to patients age, please book to general urology clinic.

# Male Infertility

- Normally processed through via Partners GP
- If the issue is the male change to Gynaecology/infertility and send to Seacroft hospital

# Not Otherwise Specified (NOS)

- Chronic Scrotal Pain
- UTI
- Circumcision Requires a PAT
- Exclusions to clinic:
  - Cases of suspected cancer should be referred under the 2-week rule. General paediatric urology - please refer to Paediatric Urology Service Erectile Dysfunction -Refer to the Andrology Service Visible & non visible Haematuria - Refer to the





 Haematuria Service Raised PSA - Refer to the PSA Service Lower Urinary tract infections - Refer to the Male LUTS Service Females with continence issues- Refer to the Female Urinary Service

#### Prostate

- Process to the NOS clinic type this will bring up two options depending on age book to either:
  - Male Lower Urinary Symptoms
  - o General urology clinic

## **Urinary Calculus**

- Stone Urology (Malton) Triage Service
  - Known recurrent stone disease previously discharged. Loin pain? typical of ureteric colic. +/- non-visible haematuria +/- visible haematuria Persistent UTIs with stones on plain film.
  - Exclusions New Ioin pain >55 yrs (exclude AAA first) Loin pain not typical of ureteric colic.

#### Vasectomy

- Any hospital if had previous surgery & needs to be General Anaesthetic / needs PAT but no proforma
- Marie stopes Leeds e-RS with proforma.
  - Provider of vasectomy services in Leeds and Wakefield for Vale of York CCG patients.
  - Patient information leaflet for Marie Stopes service
  - Marie Stopes do not have a BMI limit, but they do have weight limits for their couches. In Leeds the limit is 25 stone and in Wakefield the limit is 20 stone. The decision to undertake any operation is that of the surgeon on the day.
- Haxby Group Practice
  - Provide vasectomy services under LA for Vale of York CCG patients.

    To refer: please send the signed proforma directly to Haxby Group Practice. They will be contacted directly by the practice with an appointment.
- Humber and North Yorkshire ICB do commission vasectomies under General Anaesthetic in secondary care **only** in the following circumstances:
  - Previous documented adverse reaction to LA
  - Scarring or deformity from previous scrotal surgery or trauma that makes vasectomy under LA difficult to achieve
  - History of coagulation disorder, inguinal scrotal hernia or cryptorchidism
  - Large varicocele or hydrocele
  - Where patients have previously had vasectomy on the NHS, have subsequently had a reversal of vasectomy (privately or on the NHS) and again wish to undergo vasectomy





- Please clearly detail which of these your patient has in order for them to have a secondary care procedure.
- Fear of the procedure, or patient choice are not adequate reasons for requesting vasectomy under GA, unless supporting mitigating factors are submitted to the IFR panel by the requesting clinician.

# **Phase 2 Pathways**

#### **Urgent Suspected Cancer**

## USC Gynaecology (York and Scarborough Hospital only - RAS clinics) - pre shortlisted on Gateway

• Complete USC pathway questionnaire USC Hysteroscopy clinic (requires US scan attached)

- All patients who have had abnormal USS features (thickened endometrium or suspicion of pathology on USS).
- Patients with recurrent PMB
- o Patients with PMB who are on tamoxifen
- Exclusion to clinic:
  - Patients who have not had an ultrasound (apart from recurrent bleeds or patients on tamoxifen).
  - Patients with PMB, apart from the two high risk groups (recurrent bleeds and patients on tamoxifen) are to be referred directly for an URGENT Ultrasound. Any abnormal USS features can then be referred into this service.

# USC Gynaecology Clinic

- o Lesion Suspicious of cancer of vagina on speculum examination
- Lesion Suspicious of Cancer if Vulva
- Suspicious pelvic mass found on ultrasound (must have serum Ca125 and USS report)
- Exclusion to clinic:
  - Pelvic Mass who have not had USS
  - Patients under 16 years

#### USC Head and Neck

This pathway covers ENT and Oral & Maxillofacial Lesions are covered under the USC skin pathway.

Complete USC pathway questionnaire.

USC ENT for Scarborough/Bridlington hospital are all booked into the general service as no separate clinics types. (Direct Booking available)

#### York hospital has separate clinics to book into see below:

USC ENT Voice Clinic- (Direct Booking available)

Unexplained and persisting hoarseness for > 6 weeks (lung cancer excluded)





#### USC ENT Clinic- (Direct Booking available)

- o High/cervical dysphagia persisting >3 weeks
- Nasal obstruction

#### USC ENT Neck lump and thyroid service Clinic (Direct Booking available)

- o Unexplained and persistent lump/mass in neck
- Thyroid Lump where scan has shown suspicious features (please include scan report)

# USC Head and Neck (Max fax) - (York Hospital, Scarborough Hospital, - Direct Booking available)

- Unexplained ulceration in oral cavity or vermillion of lip for >3 weeks
- o Unexplained swelling/ lump in oral cavity or vermillion of lip
- o Red or red and white patches of oral mucosa
- o Unexplained and persistent lump / mass in neck (not thyroid

# <u>USC Upper GI - (pre shortlisted)</u>

• Please complete USC pathway questionnaire

## USC Upper GI (York Hospital, Scarborough Hospital)

- o Isolated Dysphagia any age
- o Age ≥55 with weight loss and upper abdominal pain
- o Age ≥55 with weight loss and reflux
- o Age ≥55 with weight loss and dyspepsia
- o Upper abdominal mass (suspected oesophago-gastric aetiology)

# USC Pancreaticbiliary – (York hospital only)

Patients meeting any of the criteria in this section will have an outpatient appointment arranged by the hospital: Attach copies of the radiology reports with this referral form

- o Suspected oesophago-gastric cancer found on imaging
- o Suspected primary liver cancer found on imaging
- o Suspected gall bladder cancer found on imaging
- o Suspected pancreatic cancer found on imaging
- Age ≥40 with jaundice (otherwise well)





# <u>USC Urology</u> (Malton Community hospital)

Malton is the one stop clinic for the York/Scarborough area. Initial appointment will be here. Patient will be there for a couple of hours, have any tests done at the time and get results. Follow up appointments may be done at York or Scarborough Hospital. (All RAS clinics)

- Complete pathway questionnaire
- Service available at Malton community hospital (No York/Scarborough hospital)

#### **USC** Haematuria

- o All Haematuria
- Unexplained visible haematuria (adult over 45) where a UTI has been excluded or persists or recurs after treatment of UTI
- Non-visible haematuria (aged 60 or over) AND either dysuria or raised white cell count on a blood test
- Exclusion to clinic:
- o Patients under 45 years with visible haematuria.
- Consider non-2WW Haematuria referral for everyone else outside of these age criteria. (Patients under 40 years with visible Haematuria, exclude or treat UTI).

#### USC PSA

- PSA over 10ng/ml (after exclusion of UTI) on one occasion in a man with a ten-year life expectancy Clinically malignant-feeling prostate on digital rectal examination (age under 80 yr). Requires PSA result attached
- PSA above age-specific reference range, but below 10ng/ml in a man with a likely tenyear life expectancy (after exclusion of UTI) Requires two PSA levels and Dates no less than 6 weeks apart.

# **USC** Urology

- o Elevated age specific PSA (age under 80 years),
- o Clinical malignant-feeling prostate on rectal digital examination (age under 80 years),
- o PSA value over 20ng/mL (any age, after exclusion of UTI).
- o Renal mass evident on clinical examination or imaging, solid bladder mass on imaging,
- Solid swelling in the body of the testis, penile mass or ulceration where STD has been treated or excluded.





# **Urgent & Routine first outpatient pathways**

## <u>Diagnostic Physiological Measurement / ECHO</u>

Palpitations – (pre shortlisted) (York only)

- Complete Integrated questionnaire on Gateway
- o This service is for York registered patients only
- Requires ECG attached (mandatory)
- Criteria for pathway can be found:
   valeofyorkccg.nhs.uk/seecmsfile/?id=6469&inline=1&inline=1
- Service available at York Hospital only
- o Can be booked direct to clinic without contacting patient

To refer Scarbrough registered patients for palpitations please process via Cardiology/NOS. (Scarborough Bridlington and Malton hospital)

#### Murmur – (pre shortlisted)

- Refer to the open access ECHO clinic
- 12 lead ECG (if available in primary care) must be attached to the referral
- Conditions treated:
  - o New murmurs in patients over 16 years Murmurs identified in pregnancy (please state the duration of pregnancy in the referral)
  - o People with a family relative in a first relative of congenital heart disease and with a murmur
  - People with a family history in a first degree relative of cardiomyopathy please state which type in the referral letter (Hypertrophic Obstructive Cardiomyopathy HOCM <40 years every 4 years, Dilated Cardiomyopathy DCM <50 years every 4 years)</li>
  - People with AF in whom there is a strong suspicion of structural heart disease (a murmur) and therefore warfarin will be required for anticoagulation not a Direct Oral Anticoagulant (NOAC)
  - o Younger people (<60) with AF in whom a structural problem will raise thromboembolic risk to a level where anticoagulation is required

#### o Exclusions:

- o People already under cardiology follow up
- People with symptoms of heart failure and a murmur or AF should be referred via the heart failure CAS
- Service available at York Hospital only
- Can be booked direct to clinic without contacting patient





 Scarborough registered patients have the option to also go to Scarborough Bridlington and Malton Hospital - change speciality and clinic type to Cardiology/ NOS.

#### **Gynaecology**

There are no requirements for the following clinic types. Available hospitals include York Hospital, Scarborough Hospital, Selby War Memorial, Bridlington Hospital Malton community Hospital

- o Not Otherwise Specified
- Perineal Repair Also offer St James Hospital Leeds
- Urogynaecology/Prolapse
- Vulval and Perineal Lesions

The following clinic types need changing to Not Otherwise Specified to show local clinics York Hospital, Scarborough Hospital

- o Post Menopausal Bleeding
- o Psychosexual

#### Menstrual Disorders



Some clinics may only accept patients up to 12 years old, while others may accommodate individuals up to 15 or even 19 years old. If a specific clinic does not appear in your search, please verify the age criteria listed in the Directory of Services (DoS) on the e-Referral Service (e-RS).

In cases where a provider does not offer a dedicated Child Health clinic, the adult clinic may accept patients of all ages. Referrals should initially be created under the "Children's and Adolescent Services" category. At the booking stage, you can modify the specialty or clinic (located at the bottom of the page) to display the adult clinic, if appropriate. Please refer to the guidance below for detailed instructions on this process.

#### Allergy

- York Hospital (age 18years and under), Harrogate Hospital (1 month to 15 years inclusive)
- For Scarborough Hospital (15 years and under) and The James Cook (15 years and under) –
  change the clinic type to Other Medical to bring up the general clinic to book into.
- Conditions treated: Patients presenting with a history of an acute systemic allergic reaction (anaphylaxis) or severe delayed allergic reaction. Clinical suspicion of multiple food allergies. Patient has allergic rhinitis not responsive to regular antihistamines and steroid nasal spray (see BSACI guidelines). Patients presenting with more than one antibiotic allergy. Patients with a history of chronic urticaria or idiopathic anaphylaxis. Patients with primary lactose intolerance if older than 5 years of age. Patients with possible latex allergy.
- Exclusions: Suspected allergy to topical agents refer to dermatology for patch-testing Delayed (non-IgE) cows milk allergy see iMAP guidelines refer to dietician Allergic rhinitis responsive to oral antihistamines +/- steroid nasal spray Family history of allergy unless specific concerns Eczema with no obvious relationship to common allergens (eg milk, egg)

If the GP wishes to refer as urgent but the patient does not meet urgent criteria, they can still set up the referral as urgent but at the booking stage refer into the **routine** triage clinic. The referral will be triaged and either accepted or returned with advice.

**Routine** referrals are referred via Gateway/e-RS into the routine clinic Chapel Allerton Hospital (see above)

**A&G**- The Genetics A&G team have advised they no longer accept A&G via e-RS. A&G requests should be booked into the Genetics triage clinic via Gateway/e-RS - routine Chapel Allerton Triage service. The request will be triaged and either returned with advice or arrange to see patient.

The GP needs to clearly mark at top of referral text that it is an A&G request.

## **Gynaecology - Infertility**

There are two subheadings under Infertility:

- Subfertility which is defined as a delay in conceiving, where the possibility of natural conception exists but takes longer than average. This is the first step in the infertility process
- IVF (assisted conception) the inability to conceive after one or two years of trying

All patients need to be directed to subfertility testing in the first instance.

Subfertility provider options: York Hospital, Seacroft Leeds, Hull Royal Infirmary (couples subfertility clinic)

- Complete referral questionnaire on Gateway
- Guidance on the criteria for subfertility referrals can be found here
- Semen Analysis is required as part of the pre investigations if abnormal repeat in 3months.
   (please ensure result available even if partner registered with another GP).
- Clinical Exclusions
  - Subfertility treatment is not commissioned for females with BMI >35 due to risk of pregnancy complications
  - Secondary care fertility treatment is restricted to women with BMI <30 complying with the Optimising Health Outcomes criteria
  - Smoking increases miscarriage risk and active smoking is an exclusion criteria







# Logging patient contact attempts on Gateway


The referral can be exited. This will save a contact attempt, the referral will remain open in the booking worklist










### Then select patient communication



The patient communication page will be displayed. The correspondence address will be auto filled from the address on your patient records.

The letter can then be printed locally and posted to the patient.

The letter will provide the patient with the list of hospital choices along with all the information they require to book their appointment online or by telephone via national e-RS appointments line.

If the patient has the NHS app, once a referral has been shortlisted the patient is notified via the app, which can be used to manage their referral request.






## Referring AHP & MSK referrals via Gateway Book Direct
