New placement strategy for social care nursing launched

Skills for Care is proud to launch the first-ever national placement strategy for social care nursing.

Developed in collaboration with the Council of Deans of Health, it aims to position social care as a placement of choice for all student nurses and nursing associates. It offers care providers and higher education institutions recommendations for how to deliver high-quality, consistent placement experiences.

At its core, the strategy is about building stronger connections between students, universities, and care providers. These partnerships are essential in helping students gain a broader perspective on health and care, including experience in person-centred, community-based, and multidisciplinary settings.

By showcasing the unique opportunities that social care offers, this strategy also helps encourage more newly qualified nurses to explore careers in the sector.


This seminar offers a supportive, interactive environment where participants can learn, share ideas and ask questions.


