GOVERNING BODY MEETING: 6 AUGUST 2015

Chief Clinical Officer's Report

1. Purpose of the Report

To provide an update on a number of projects, initiatives and meetings which have taken place since the last Governing Body meeting and any associated issues.

2. System Resilience

- 2.1 The CCG has worked in partnership with NHS Scarborough and Ryedale CCG, NHS East Riding of Yorkshire CCG and York Teaching Hospital NHS Foundation Trust to develop a 'System Recovery Plan' that focuses on short term performance recovery.
- 2.2 This work has been developed through the Collaborative Improvement Board and associated System Resilience Working Groups on Planned and Unplanned Care.
- 2.3 The plan was developed in response to the tripartite meeting which has previously been reported to the Governing Body. This work is now being further refined to provide an impact analysis and a programme office approach to ensure delivery of the proposed work within the CCG.
- 2.4 This is intrinsically linked to the longer 'Sustainable System' work through the CCG's plans for integration and the establishment of a System Leaders Group for the Vale of York area.

3. Primary Care Co-Commissioning

- 3.1 The CCG has achieved 'significant assurance' from Internal Audit at North Yorkshire Audit Services (NYAS) for its work to establish arrangements for Primary Care Co-Commissioning.
- 3.2 A workshop meeting with stakeholders was held in May 2015 to identify priority areas to focus work and consider the role of the Primary Care Strategy Group and how it can support the work of the Committee to deliver Primary Care Reform.

- 3.3 The CCG is now actively managing requests from practices in relation to infrastructure and boundary changes and it is awaiting more detail from NHS England before the final handover of responsibilities i.e. complaints.
- 3.4 The next Primary Care Co-Commissioning Meeting will be held in September 2015.

4. Procurements

- 4.1 The contract for mental health and learning disability services was awarded to Tees, Esk and Wear Valleys NHS Foundation Trust on 11 June 2015. The contract mobilisation period is underway. The contract formally begins on 1 October 2015.
- 4.2 The contract for musculoskeletal clinical assessment triage and treatment services (MSK) was awarded to Healthshare Limited on 27 July 2015. The contract mobilisation is about to commence. The contract formally begins on 1 November 2015.

5. Pioneering through Partnerships

5.1 Work continues with the national team to agree a support package which will accelerate the delivery of integration pilots and system wide work in the Vale of York to develop new integrated out-of hospital models of care.

6. Integrating Health and Social Care in the Vale of York

- 6.1 Work continues to accelerate the delivery and impact of the schemes being delivered through the Better Care Fund. A support package from NHS England, including extra Project Management and Business Intelligence resource, is being negotiated with no financial impact to the CCG.
- 6.2 It is hoped that by 1 September 2015 there will be support in place to help focus upon working with local authority colleagues and help to implement whole system work.
- 6.3 Through the Joint Delivery Group, the CCG and its partners continue to closely monitor the delivery of the Better Care Fund. Working together, we are developing ways to fully understand any consequences of stopping schemes that do not deliver the necessary system change.

7. Public and Patient Engagement (PPE)

- 7.1 The latest public and patient engagement event took place on Wednesday 10 June 2015. The event which was hosted in partnership with the CCG, Healthwatch North Yorkshire, North Yorkshire County Council and York Teaching Hospital NHS Foundation Trust was a great success and allowed us to ask Easingwold communities and the surrounding localities about what matters to them about local health and care services.
- 7.2 The feedback from the event has been published on the CCG's website at <u>http://www.valeofyorkccg.nhs.uk/current-work/health-and-wellbeingin-easingwold-and-the-local-area/</u>. This important information will be used to help to build a shared vision that will provide the best in health and wellbeing for the local community.

8. North Yorkshire Compact – WorkingTogether

- 8.1 The CCG has been invited to sign up to the Working Together Compact, a written agreement that provides a framework for the way in which voluntary, community and social enterprise sector (VCSE) organisations and the public sector work together.
- 8.2 The Compact sets out how the sectors help to achieve the following outcomes:
 - A strong and diverse and independent civil society.
 - Effective and transparent design and development of policies, commissioning, programmes and public services.
 - Responsive and high-quality programmes and services.
 - Clear arrangements for managing changes to programmes and services.
 - Improved community health and wellbeing.
 - An equal and fair society.
- 8.3 The Compact brings together VCSE organisations, County and District Councils and Clinical Commissioning Groups. It has been drawn up using the framework for the national compact and feedback from a 12 week consultation that was held between November 2013 and February 2014.
- 8.4 It is my recommendation that the Governing Body agrees to the CCG becoming a signatory of the North Yorkshire Working Together Compact.

9. North Yorkshire Health and Wellbeing Board

- 9.1 The North Yorkshire Health and Wellbeing Board is seeking local views on its strategy about what is important for good health and social care.
- 9.2 The draft strategy takes the themes of:
 - connecting communities creating places where communities flourish and people can shape the services they need;
 - starting well promoting childhood health;
 - living well –identifying ways in which people can live a healthier lifestyle; and
 - ageing well- encouraging people to take steps to ensure they can enjoy a healthy, independent lifestyle for longer and how to address issues such as loneliness and isolation.
- 9.3 The strategy takes into account the latest evidence from the North Yorkshire Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA) as well as changes in national policy, local ambition and what local people have already said is important to them for their long term health and wellbeing.
- 9.4 The strategy's consultation period is open until 19 August 2015. The strategy and the consultation are available online at <u>www.northyorks.gov.uk/jhwsconsultation.</u>
