Purpose of Report For Decision				
Rationale				
The NHS Vale of York CCG is involved in collaborative decision making across different system footprints for certain services or service design. The CCG is involved in collaborative commissioning relationships with the 23 CCGs across Yorkshire and Humber for the Yorkshire Ambulance Service and Humber Coast and Vale STP footprint. To improve decision making and transparency for each CCG, the paper proposes a formal Joint Collaborative Commissioning Committee is established for both of these collaborations and supporting Memoranda of Understanding are attached.				
The paper will require the NHS Vale of York CCG Constitution to be reviewed and amended to incorporate any agreed delegated authorities. This will be taken forward through the annual review of the Constitution.				
From now until October 2016 these arrangements will operate in shadow form and formal delegated agreements will not be put in place until then. This will give the CCG an opportunity to develop its approach to more formal delegation.				
At its meeting on 19 May 2016 the Council of Representatives approved this direction of travel and delegated the responsibility for signing off the collaborative arrangements and their ongoing monitoring to the Governing Body.
